- **From the beginning of the Spring Term 2018 we will be a Nut Free School.** We have pupils who suffer from a severe allergy to nuts. For some pupils, coming into contact with nuts causes a potentially life threatening anaphylactic reaction. This reaction can be induced by smell, touch or ingestion of nuts. In order for us to reduce the risk of an anaphylactic reaction occurring at school, we would be very grateful if you could refrain from sending your child to school with nuts, or any product containing nuts, for consumption at break or lunch time. Thank you

- **A congratulations from Mrs Williams** to Ruby in Class 3, for her commitment to singing club. - **School lunch payments** If you pay for your child's school lunch please remember to make regular advance payments on the School Gateway so that your child's lunch money is always in credit. Thank you.
- **A New Year's resolution?** Please can all parents make sure that **every** item which your child brings into school is clearly and permanently named, including PE kit, outdoor clothing, **wellingtons** and

spare winter weather clothing. Please could you also check to see if any of your child's property has ended up in the lost property box in the main entrance.

- **Medicines in school** – please may we remind parents only medicine prescribed by a doctor in its original container can be brought into school and must be handed in to the school office where a form detailing its use must be filled in and signed by a parent. Medicines such as penicillin which have to be given 3 times a day should not be brought in to school as dose times can be fitted in around the school day. Over the counter medicine such as Nurofen, Calpol, antihistamines etc will not be administered by staff and must not be brought in.
