### Premiership Primary Stars

We have worked closely with the Premiership (the educational body of the football Premiership).

### Forest School & Outdoor Learning

Sporting Start have experienced staff in delivering Forest School and outdoor learning. Please also remember that your staff can access free training at the Pavillions, Harrogate for a variety of outdoor learning and bush craft, including pond dipping, geocaching and active literacy and numeracy. ### Staff CPD

We are keen to provide more CPD to enable your own staff to provide high quality PE and games within your setting. Currently 40% of member schools in the 2017-2018 year have taken up twilight or in school training session for their staff. Please let us know of any further training you would like to be provided, these are inclusive of the annual price.





## Gifted and Talented Academy (Separate to schools)

Sporting Start has always provided assessment and feedback to schools where pupils are deemed to be excelling in physical activity. However, over time, we identified the need for these pupils to be offered a club where they could meet with like-minded children and take part in a variety of sports with other pupils of equal ability. The aim being to bridge the gap between PE and physical ability.

Whilst some children are already competing at a high level in sports outside of school, others have not had access to clubs and this scheme is helping to feed pupils into local clubs.

This program is now run separately from the schools, however all primary schools have access to putting children forwards for assessment. The assessment is inclusive to all pupils. This assessment, has enabled to pupils to be assessed against the national criteria across a range of skills, they are re-tested on an ongoing basis in order for progress to be recorded. They attend sessions in nutrition, sports psychology, sportsmanship and tactical awareness. Sporting Start run this voluntarily.

The Gifted and Talented Academy receives no funding from school but The Gifted and Talented Academy receives no funding from school but instead is paid for directly by parents. However staff from Sporting Start give their time on a voluntary basis and all monies received from parent contributions has paid for trips and activities that the children have undertaken. 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## Sport Council

Once again, this year we have charged schools a premium to access the cluster Sport Council. We hope that you feel that this has been a good use of your Sport Premium funding.

Each school can have unlimited places for Y5/6 pupils. Applications were sent to all schools and we were overwhelmed with the volume of applications this academic year.

In total 40 children were selected for Sport Council. They have been attending regular Sport Council training sessions.

The children have had the opportunity to meet Freddie Woodward (Olympic Diver) and learn about his experiences at the 2016 Rio Olympic Games.

The children have also been working towards the Sport Leaders UK qualification in Young Sport Leadership. During this training they learn about the Paralympic and Olympic Values.

The Sport Council members have also been asked to set up lunchtime clubs within their schools. Thank you to all the schools for embracing this and supporting your children with setting these clubs up.

The Sport Councils final activities for the year will involve a special day out learning teamwork skills. They will get the chance to do Archery and leadership tasks.



## Expenditure

The Cluster Coordinator costs of £750 paid by each school at the start of 2015 has been allocated as follows:

- Staffing 20%
- Medals & Trophies 15%
- Equipment 30%
- Administration 15%
- Venue Hire 20%

### Hours

- Admin for competitions – 120 hours
- Competitions – 90 hours
- Cluster Sport Day Admin – 45 hours

The Sports Council costs of £250 per school per annum have been allocated as follows:

- Logbooks 5%
- Venue Hire (for training and event day) 15%
- Olympic athlete visit 30%
- Medals and trophies (for event day) 10%
- Staffing 10%
- Equipment 5%
- Activity day for young leaders 25%

You will note that a significant amount of the Young Leaders fee is put towards the summer cluster sports day that we run on an annual basis. This means that we can run well organized and managed event at no further costs to the school (other than your transportation).



## Proposals for 2018-2019 Sporting Cluster

We appreciate the costs involved in getting your children to events and the time spent out of the classroom and are therefore very conscious that we need the cluster to work both cost and time effectively. For 2018-2019, we would like to introduce next year is a 'disengaged programme'. We appreciate that not all children enjoy physical activity and that competitive sport can further exacerbate the situation. This will take some careful consideration and planning but we feel it can further enhance the service we offer to our schools and their pupils. The program will run as 6 sessions per year (one per half term). Schools can send up to 10 pupils to participate in the activities.
